a) General – all four licensing objectives (b, c, d and e) (please read guidance note 11)

To generally achieve all four of the licensing objectives we will apply the adequate measures to ensure the responsible sale and consumption of alcohol. The hut situated on the 18th hole will be staffed by experienced staff members who have been provided with training on the licensing objectives and signed documents to confirm they've understood what will be required of them, such as age verification procedures and conflict resolution advice to equip them with the necessary skills manage any disorderly conduct in the unlikely event it will happen. As well as be provided with any necessary equipment such as first aid kits to assist with medical injuries.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

The first step will be to provide comprehensive staff training to help them monitor alcohol consumption and sobriety. We will ensure they will have means of communicating with other staff members to address any disruptive behaviour instantly to ensure the safety of staff and other patrons. We will also collaborate with local law enforcement agencies and share information to address any escalating issues.

c) Public safety

Ensuring public safety is paramount and we will adhere to all health and safety regulations, including fire safety protocol. The hut will be equipped with adequate lighting, and first aid supplies to address any potential safety concerns and our staff will receive training to best assist our patrons in the case of medical emergency. We will carry out regular inspections on the service area to ensure that the hut and it's surrounding area are safe for all staff and visitors.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

To prevent public nuisance, we will strive to maintain the tranquillity of the area. The location of the hut is remote and situated at the end of our course, far away from any public roads, entrances, or land, it is in our best interest to ensure that there are adequate waste disposal options, and service to prevent any issues from arising. As a halfway hut we expect the nature of service to be a place where our customers can buy refreshments and continue with their game preventing the likelihood of there being any binge drinking. Additionally, there will be operational constraints with set hours of service that will only be during the hours of golf taking place to prevent customers dwelling.

e) The protection of children from harm

In order to protect children from harm we will be providing staff with the necessary training to refuse service to minors by adhering to our current challenge 25 procedure and to be able to spot fake ID's. Additionally, we will educate staff on safeguarding to recognise signs of vulnerability or distress and collaborate with local authorities to escalate any issues as necessary.

Notes for Guidance

This application cannot be used to vary the licence so as to extend the period for which the licence has effect or to vary substantially the premises to which it relates. If you wish to make that type of change to the premises licence, you should make a new premises licence application under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.

- 1. You do not have to pay a fee if the only purpose of the variation for which you are applying is to avoid becoming liable for the late night levy
- Describe the premises. For example, the type of premises, its general situation and layout and any other information which could be relevant to the licensing objectives. Where your application includes off-supplies of alcohol and you intend to provide a place of consumption of these off-supplies of alcohol, you must include a description of where the place will be and its proximity to the premises.

 - Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
 - Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
 - Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports – defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts – are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
 - Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
 - Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar

community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.

- any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
