Fully documented staff training, to include training on the Premises Licence conditions as well as the premises; licence will be held on site. Challenge 25 Policy will displayed prominently. Training will be undertaken at regular intervals throughout the calendar year, at a minimum every 6 months. Staff will sign and date documentation at the conclusion of their training session, acknowledging that they have received and fully understood the training provided to them. This will be made for inspection by any Responsible Authority under the Licensing Act 2003. All staff will be trained with respect to underage sales, such training to be updated as necessary when legislation changes and should include training in proxy sales and how to refuse sales to difficult customers. Safeguarding training should also be undertaken with all staff. Training will be clearly documented, signed and dated by both the trainer and member of staff receiving it. This documentation will be available for inspection on request by an authorised officer of the Licensing Authority or a Constable. These records will be kept for a minimum of 12 months

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

Gwent Police have agreed to the following:

Opening Hours: 10:00am-01:30am Monday to Thursday 10:00am- 03:00am Friday to Saturday 11:00am- 03:00am Sunday for sales of alcohol, provision of late night refreshment, live music, recorded music and performance of dance, to finish twenty minutes before close.

## c) Public safety

Minimum 2 Security Industry Authority SIA-licensed door supervisors will be on duty at the entrance of the premises from 21:00hrs on Fri, Sat, Sunday if open passed 00:00am (midnight), Bank Holiday Sunday and non standing times. If the capacity exceeds 150 persons, 1 further Security Industry Authority SIA-licensed door supervisor shall be on duty per 100 customers at the premises from 21:00 hrs on Fri, Sat, Sunday if open passed 00:00am (midnight), Bank Holiday Sunday and non standing times. The need for further SIA Door Supervisors/ Stewards will be assessed by the Licence holder / Designated Premises Supervisor on a regular basis and additional SIA Door Supervisors/ Stewards will be employed when and where the assessment requires, or when directed by Gwent Police or other responsible licencing authority. It is the Premises Licence Holder will ensure that the following details for each Door Supervisor/ Steward, are contemporaneously entered into a bound register kept for that purpose: (i) Full name; (ii) (ii) Where applicable- SIA Certificate number and or badge number, or registration number of any accreditation scheme recognised by the Licensing Authority (including expiry date of that registration or accreditation); (iii) (i) The time they began their duty; (iv) (iv) The time they completed their duty. This register will be kept and will be maintained as to enable an authorised officer of the Licensing Authority or a constable to establish the particulars of all door stewards engaged at the

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NOTES ON REGULATED ENTERTAINMENT

In terms of specific regulated entertainments please note that:

- Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
  - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
  - Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
    - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
    - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
    - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
  - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
  - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
  - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
  - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
