a) General – all four licensing objectives (b, c, d and e) (please read guidance note 10)

We will promote the four licensing objectives through the measures outlined in each section below. Staff will be correctly trained, measures will be monitored and reviewed regularly to ensure they are being applied consistently and correctly. We will implement appropriate changes where necessary to improve promotion of the objectives. Lisset Burrett shall ensure that all times when Colin's is open for any licensable activity that there are sufficient competent staff on duty to fulfil the terms of the licence, to prevent crime and disorder and to discourage and tackle drunkenness and prevent the sale of alcohol to minors.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

- i. Staff will receive training to ensure their understanding of the social responsibilities associated with the sale of alcohol.
- ii. Customers will not be allowed to leave the premises with alcohol they have purchased. Signage and notes on the menu will make this clear. Staff will be trained to prevent this happening.
- iii. Persons deemed to be already intoxicated or otherwise disorderly will not be allowed on the premises and will not be served.
- iv. Customers who appear under the age of 25 will be asked to provide ID proving they are over 18 years of age.
- v. We will promote sensible drinking and will not offer promotions that encourage binge drinking, such as 'Happy Hours'.
- vi. Alcohol will only be served with a food purchase.
- vii. Training, where mentioned above, will be documented.

c) Public safety

- i. Empty bottles and glasses will be cleared away promptly.
- ii. Staff receive food handling safety training before they start working at the premises.
- iii. Risk assessments are carried out and regularly reviewed for kitchen and serving operations. General staff training ensures staff are aware of and adhere to these.
- iv. Emergency evacuation routes are kept clear.
- v. Emergency procedures including evacuation of staff and customers, and alerting emergency services are established and practised regularly.
- vi. Adequate first aid materials and a trained first aider will be onsite during operating hours.
- vii. Appropriate lighting is in place at all times.
- viii. We operate an occupancy limit to ensure against overcrowding.
- ix. Electrical safety checks will be carried out at least annually.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

- i. Alcohol sales will end 30 minutes prior to closing.
- ii. Customers will be asked to leave the premises quietly and clear signage will be provided to remind them.
- iii. There will be a zero-tolerance policy towards customers who are persistently rowdy when leaving the premises.
- iv. When amplification is used during live music events, doors and windows will be kept closed to minimise noise nuisance.

e) The protection of children from harm

- i. Staff will be trained to ensure they comply with the law regarding the consumption of alcohol by those under the age of 18, including the prevention of adults buying alcohol for minors.
- ii. Anyone appearing to be under 25 years of age will be asked to show photographic ID to prove they are over 18 years of age.
- iii. Alcohol will not be displayed near the ice cream display cabinet.
- iv. We provide suitable seating for children.



 - Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
 - Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
 - Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
 - Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
 - Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500,

- and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
- any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.

Right to work/Immigration status

A licence may not be held by an individual or an individual in a partnership which is not a limited liability partnership who is resident in the UK who:

does not have the right to live and work in the UK; or

• is subject to a condition preventing him or her from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

Any premises licence issued in respect of an application made on or after 6 April 2017 will become invalid if the holder ceases to be entitled to work in the UK.

Applicants must demonstrate that they have an entitlement to work in the UK and are not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity. They do this in one of two ways:

- 1) by providing with this application copies or scanned copies of the documents which an applicant may provide to demonstrate their entitlement to work in the UK (which do not need to be certified) that are published on GOV.UK and in guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 2) by providing their 'share code' to enable the licensing authority to carry out a check using the Home Office online right to work checking service (see below).

Home Office online right to work checking service

As an alternative to providing a cop of original documents, applicants may demonstrate their right to work by allowing the licensing authority to carry out a check with the Home Office online right to work checking service.

To demonstrate their right to work via the Home Office online right to work checking service, applicants should include in this application their 9-digit share code (provided to them upon accessing the service at https://www.gov.uk/prove-right-to-work) which, along with the applicant's date of birth (provided within this application), will allow the licensing authority to carry out the check.

In order to establish the applicant's right to work, the check will need to indicate that the applicant is allowed to work in the United Kingdom and is not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

An online check will not be possible in all circumstances because not all applicants will have an immigration status that can be shared digitally. The Home Office online right to work checking service sets out what information and/or documentation applicants will need in order to access the service. Applicants who are unable to obtain a share code from the service should submit copies of documents as set out above.

Your right to work will be checked as part of your licensing application and this could involve us checking your immigration status with the Home Office. We may otherwise share information with the Home Office. Your licence application will not be determined until you have complied with this guidance.
